

Information for student orientation

Providers valued making Placement-specific orientation information available to Students before Placements. They report this should:

$\hfill \square$ set the tone of the Placement and clearly state the Provider's expectations for the	
Placement	
$\ \square$ explain the importance of:	
0	partnering respectfully with participants
0	articulating and solving problems
0	understanding confidentiality
0	clinical knowledge
0	specific clinical skills
$\hfill\square$ prompt students to consider their personal experience with disability as relevant	
background experience for the placement, particularly when planning personal	
learning goals for the placement	
$\hfill \square$ describe the range of participants and their families supported by the provider	
organisation, as well as the services provided	
\square reinforce professional standards - dress codes, identification	
$\hfill\square$ explain the NDIA and the NDIS in a case study format and addressing the question	
"How does the NDIS work in the context of a participant's journey from initial	
assessment through to service/equipment provision?". Case studies should:	
0	reflect participants supported by the provider organisation

- o illustrate the importance, within the NDIS funding context, of:
 - efficient time management
 - being goal orientated, organised and staying on track with participants
